District Attorney Kirk Adams learned late Thursday afternoon that because the alleged crime occurred on Fort Rucker, it fell under federal jurisdiction.

Adams said the exclusive federal jurisdiction news caught him and the Dale County Sheriff's Office off

"The exclusive jurisdiction part of Fort Rucker was something totally new to the 10 of us that were at the hospital, and there were some folks there that had quite a bit of experience with that," Adams said. "Typically, things that happen on Fort Rucker have been in a concurrent jurisdiction, where (the military) can prosecute and we can prosecute. According to their map, there is no concurrent jurisdiction. It's their total jurisdiction."

From here, military officials will handle the investigation. All Adams can do is watch and hope.

"As a prosecutor, I want to see that justice is served, and when someone commits this type of crime, they're punished appropriately," he said. "Even though this child laid dead at the Dale County hospital, there's nothing I can do about it, and that's very disturbing. The military has capable prosecutors, and I just have to trust that they prosecute him appropriately and he doesn't receive any benefits just because he's a soldier."
