

## Dale jury: Woman guilty of shooting at man in vehicle

OZARK — A Dale County jury found a Pinckard woman guilty on Wednesday of shooting into a vehicle occupied by a man driving near her home, according to authorities.

Cynthia McClendon, 40, of Dale County Road 554 was found guilty and could be sentenced to between two and 20 years in a state prison at a later date for the crime.

According to court testimony, McClendon got off a horse and shot multiple times toward a truck driven by Adam Peterman in June 2008.

McClendon's husband, Bryan, said Peterman's truck sounded like other vehicles that had been driven wildly through the road in the area.

Peterman said he was just passing by McClendon to check some fields in the area that he farmed when she shot at him, leaving one bullet hole in the windshield of his truck.

"I had never seen this woman before that day," Peterman said.

McClendon's attorney, David Harrison, questioned whether Peterman had known McClendon before the incident and whether Peterman tried to scare McClendon with the truck on the day of the incident.

Peterman denied ever doing so.

McClendon's trial started on Tuesday with Peterman's testimony and ended a little after closing arguments on Wednesday.
