

Slocomb student arrested in poison plot

Police say 15-year-old planned to kill teacher

A Slocomb High School student, who police say plotted to poison a teacher, has been arrested and charged with making terrorist threats and attempted murder.

Geneva County District Attorney Kirke Adams said the student, a 15-year-old male, had threatened to kill a teacher, purchased poison off the Internet to do the deed and brought the poison to school.

Dale Marsh, an attorney for the school system, said no teachers or students were harmed as a result of the incident.

According to information from the Geneva County Schools, once school officials became aware of the incident, the student was questioned and referred to in-school suspension for the remainder of the day. The Slocomb Police Department was contacted, and an investigation was conducted that resulted in the arrest of the student.

According to the school system, the student is not presently attending Slocomb High School. Slocomb Police Chief Don White said the student is currently at the Southeast Alabama Juvenile Diversion Center.
