## Operation Who's Next Part 2 Underway

Geneva County Sheriff Greg Ward told members of the media several weeks ago that "Operation Who's Next 2" was underway. Last week he made it official with two arrests followed up just a few days later with three additional arrests.

Sheriff Ward announced the arrests of Tyrone Wells and Winifer Weston.

Wells is charged with Distribution of Controlled Substance. He received a bond of \$150,000.

Weston is charged with conspiracy to commit a drug crime and distribution of a controlled substance. She has a bond of \$250,000.

Wells was arrested on a grand jury indictment at the Geneva Piggly Wiggly while Weston was arrested in a different area of town.

Sheriff Ward said that in each case there is over-

whelming evidence to support each case. "We would make a call and they would deliver," said Ward.

Ward also stated that in the case of Weston, she was arrested in the first Operation Who's Next campaign. Ward said that he is currently attempting to have her bond revoked for the first arrest which would result in her sitting in jail until her hearing actually took place which would not

be until sometime in 2009 at the earliest.

Ward promised during the announcement of the first arrests that there would be more to come. It didn't take long for it to happen.

Investigators with the Geneva County drug task force arrested 33-year-old Cynthia Scott of Geneva and charged her with unlawful distribution of crack, along with one-count

of conspiracy to commit a drug crime.

They also arrested Darrell Jenkins of Dothan. He is charged with two-counts of unlawful distribution and 32-year-old Cedric McIntyre faces one-count of unlawful distribution as well.

Sheriff Ward says these are some of the new faces in the second operation.

Over the last year, authorities have been target-

ing the crack dealers.

The sheriff says this is in response to citizen complaints concerning narcotics being sold in their neighborhoods.

"The defense attorneys bombarded out CI the first time," said Ward. Ward feels that this won't be the case this time because there are multiple witnesses to each case as well as a new item that wasn't used in the first operation, video

evidence.

"At least two were watching each deal as it took place," said Ward. "Jurors will also be able to see it first hand this time."

Local law enforcement agencies also knew of the operation and were available for assistance if called up according to Ward. "We work together in a variety of ways to see that drugs are taken off the streets in Geneva County."
