

Geneva County Jury Finds Daniels Guilty

A Geneva County jury took just 40 minutes to convict Jonah "Moonie" Daniels, 34, of Madrid, AL, of Distribution of a Controlled Substance.

After a one-day trial the jury found that Daniels sold an "8 ball" of crack cocaine worth \$250 to an informant of the Geneva County Drug Task Force.

Assistant District Attorney Stephen Smith who tried the case said, "This was another fine effort of the Geneva County Drug Task Force to rid Geneva County of drug dealers." Testimony showed that this informant was a user who previously bought drugs from the Defendant.

"The informant showed great courage in standing up to this drug dealer. Her motivation was to put this drug dealer out of business and to keep others from being victimized

District Attorney Kirke Adams said, "Law enforcement is doing all we can to try to combat drugs in Geneva and Dale counties, and I am so grateful to this jury for finding Daniels guilty."

Judge P. B. McLaughlin, Jr. increased Daniels' bond from \$5,000 to \$25,000 after the verdict, and he remains in jail at this time, pending his sentencing hearing.
