New search conducted in Peoples case, no new info released

Law enforcement conducted a new search over the weekend involving the Shanna Peoples miss-

ing person case, but no new information was released at a press conference Monday.

Dale and Geneva County District Attorney Kirke Adams conducted the press conference accompanied by Federal

Bureau of Investigation Special Agent Susan Hanson and Lt. Barry Tucker of the Alabama Bureau of Investigation. The search was announced in a news release Friday, and Adams said that several law enforcement agencies and the Florida Panhandle Search & Rescue Dog Team searched in Alabama and Florida on Saturday and Sunday.

Neither Adams, Hanson or Tucker commented on what leads initiated the search, nor would they say if anything was turned up by the search. Adams said the case remains a "priority."

"We are using every technological or forensic avenue," Adams said, and urged the public to continue providing information. "We know that everyone wants to have Shanna home."

"Please come forward," said Peoples' mother, Wendy McKee. "Anything you know please tell someone.

"Hold on to your kids and tell them you love them every night. I don't have that with Shanna," McKee said.

Peoples was last seen September 8, 2011 at about 3:30 p.m. on North Morris Street in Geneva. A search involving a large number of law enforcement agencies has been underway since Peoples was reported missing. Adams described Peoples as having "limited mental capacity."
