County DTF Makes Another Arrest

Geneva County Sheriff Greg Ward says that he is constantly getting complaints about drug activity in the Hartford area. Many of those complaints are related to one individual.

Ward gave the citizens of that area a reason to be happy last week with the arrest of that one individual, Larry Don Sullen.

Sullen, of 308 North Third Avenue in Hartford, was arrested and charged with two counts of distribution. His bond has been set at \$300,000.

Sullen is currently sitting in the Geneva County jail on those charges.

"His name has always been mentioned in relations to drug activity in Hartford," said Ward. "I've received lots of complaints."

Ward says that despite the numerous comments about the possibility of Sullen being involved in drug activity, it involves more than just going out and making an arrest. "It takes time to get certain ones that continue to come up in relation to drug activity in the county at times," said Ward.

Ward said that his department will continue to go after those names that frequently come up but reminds everyone that in some cases it will take time.

"We believe that Mr. Sullen has connections to a lot of others in Hartford community and this will cut down on the number of drug activity in that area.

Hartford Mayor Jeff Sorrells is extremely excited about the work that the county Drug Task Force is doing in his community.

"We are very interested in combatting the drug problem in our community," said Sorrells. "It seems to be a county wide problem and the Sheriff and his staff are working hard to assist the cities as well."

Sorrells said that drug problems in the city of Hartford was one of the issues that would come up recently while he was out on the campaign trail. "We are appreciative of what has happened so far with "Operation Who's Next" and we are very excited to see what has happened to date with the operation."

Sheriff Ward indicated that additional arrests in the overall operation are being worked out currently and that additional work will begin taking place in Hartford and other parts of eastern Geneva County.
