## ABI to investigate

OZARK — Wade Robbins said he risked his life for his daughter on Monday when a neighbor threatened them with a gun after they walked past his residence and waved.

Robbins said a police officer who fatally shot the man intervened before Robbins was physically injured.

said an officer arrived shortly afterward and the shooting took place.

"I called the police (but) I was going to protect my daughter," Robbins said.

"If I didn't do what I had to do when I saw he had a gun, then who's to say what would've happened the next day I walked up the street or something?"

Residents throughout the neighborhood said the man who was shot was generally a nice man.

Howard Hinton, who said he witnessed the shooting, said he knew the man and his family for some time.

"I looked in his eyes (before the shooting) and he just seemed like a different person this time," Hinton said. "He's always been peaceful before."
