

# Geneva man faces sex abuse charges

A Geneva man is in custody, charged with multiple sex abuse charges.

Capt. Ricky Morgan of the

Geneva Police Department reports that on June 22 GPD obtained warrants for the arrest of Bradley Paul Boggs on

charges of rape 1st, two counts of sodomy 1st and sexual abuse of a child under the age of 12, allegedly an eight-year-old girl.

Morgan said the incidents were first reported to GPD on April 20, and the case was investigated with the help of the Southeast Alabama Child Advocacy Center and the Department of Human Resources.

Morgan said the child told her mother about the incidents and the mother immediately contacted GPD. The child was interviewed and further investigation led to the arrests.

Boggs is being held in Geneva County Jail on a total of \$220,000 in bonds.

Salter, 40, was walking past Magnolia Market when she allegedly found a 1998 Isuzu Rodeo with the keys in the ignition, and took the vehicle.

The owner found the vehicle missing when he exited the market and immediately called Geneva County 911.

Salter ended up at the Escambia County Ag Center on Interstate 10, where told officers from the Florida Highway Patrol that she ran out of gas. Officers ran the tag of the vehicle and found that it was stolen. Salter resisted arrest but was taken into custody by FHP, Morgan said.

Salter is charged with theft of property 1st in Geneva, and motor vehicle theft, resisting arrest and possession of stolen property in Florida. She is being held in Escambia County Jail.

**Two charged with distribution in Samson:** Two Samson men are charged with unlawful distribution of a controlled substance (marijuana).

Samson Assistant Police Chief Darrell Smith said that both arrests are part of the ongoing crackdown on narcotics dealing in Samson.

Felony warrants were out on Ommie John Michael Williams when Smith said that he and Ofc. Kelly Dean spotted Williams at the corner of S. Bay and Early streets last week. The officers arrested Williams and transported him to Geneva County Jail.

Sgt. Chad Green of the Samson Police Department arrested Russell Tripp Clayton on similar charges last week. Clayton was previously charged with felony animal cruelty 1st in April 2014 for allegedly beating a small dog to death with a shovel.
